**Subject:** Alternative cutlery for IEC load.

## Background:

The “Berlin” style IEC cutlery specified in AS/NZS 2007.1:2005 (Table A3) is no longer available.

## Ruling:

Replacement cutlery is now available from the supplier, WfK, in Germany. Details for the replacement of item numbers 7–11 in Table A3 are as follows:

This new IEC cutlery is as specified in 59A/152/CDV which was agreed to by all IEC members in October 2011.

**Laboratories should note that the new IEC cutlery must never be mixed with the old (Berlin) cutlery. Complete sets of the one type of cutlery must be used in both the test machine and the reference machine when testing to AS/NZS 2007.1. The use of the old (Berlin) cutlery will continue to be permitted until further notice.**
