Why are we here?

- Energy regulators long desired to regulate gas equipment efficiency
- This meeting marks a new stage in that process
- It marks the move to new levels of cooperation between government and industry not seen previously





Historical context

1986	Electrical labelling scheme started in states
1992	National electrical scheme commences – water heating a priority
1992	National Greenhouse Response Strategy – product efficiency proposed
1998	National Greenhouse Strategy – proposes gas follow electrical scheme
1999	Government officials discuss cooperation with AGA members
2002	Consultant recommends elements for possible gas water heater regulation
2003	Government officials decide to ask Ministers for regulation mandate
2004	Ministers agree
2005	Switched on Gas released
2005	Gas water heater round robin underway
2006	Consumer survey of label awareness and round robin completed


Why are we really here?






- There is a need to better reflect future work activity

What do regulators expect?

- On the work plan An agreed industry position that can be reported to Ministers in January 2007
- On measures to improve gas water heater test and label An industry commitment now
- On a published revision of test method AS 4552 Industry agreement to timetable of July 2007 for a published draft and December 2007 for the final.
- On a voluntary agreement to improve efficiency Industry agreement to the proposal being reported to Ministers in January 2007, the voluntary process commenced from February 2007 and the scheme to start in 2008
- On the future of water heater labelling Industry agreement to debate the long term future in June 2007
